Fund Objective

The Sesfikile Boutique Collective Investments Property Fund Class B1 is a portfolio which aims to deliver both a high income yield as well as capital growth over the medium to long term. Our objective is to deliver total returns (consisting of income and capital) that outperform the FTSE/JSE All Property Index (J803) over a 3 to 5 year investment horizon. The fund is suitable for investors who are looking for a viable property component to a balanced portfolio; or alternatively an investor looking for a growing income stream but is willing to be exposed to an element of capital volatility. The portfolio may from time to time invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments.



Fund Strategy

This fund aims to outperform the benchmark by investing in listed property companies with sustainable income growth underpinned by strong property fundamentals. In addition to these core holdings, the fund makes use of tactical stock selection to capitalise on short-term market mispricing and corporate action opportunities.

Investment Policy

The policy is to invest in JSE listed Real Estate Investment Trusts (“REITs”) or listed property companies. The investment manager will also be allowed to invest in financial instruments and cash as allowed by the act from time to time in order to achieve its investment objective. Furthermore, and as legislation permits, the manager shall be permitted to invest in offshore listed property investments on behalf of the Sesfikile BCI Property Fund.

Market Review

South African listed property started the final quarter on a strong footing. The sector rebounded from the previous month’s losses and ended October with the FTSE/JSE All Property Index (ALPI) delivering +8.13% – its best monthly return this year – while the FTSE/JSE All Share Index (ALSI) gained +1.64% as resources (-5.4%) and tech (-1.96%) took a breather. Financials (+8.52%) and Property were neck and neck, benefiting from the global risk-on sentiment. Property counters were supported by easing local bond yields, with the SA 10-year government yield falling 30bps to 8.98%, helping the FTSE/JSE All Bond Index (ALBI) close +2.56% for the month.

South Africa’s economic landscape in October reflected cautious stability, with improving external conditions offset by softer domestic momentum. The market digested the U.S. Federal Reserve’s second 25bps rate cut of the year and its cautious tone on further easing. South Africa recorded a stronger-than-expected R21.8bn trade surplus in September, while the country’s removal from the FATF grey list further boosted confidence, restoring credibility to the financial system and improving the outlook for foreign investment flows. Retail sales growth slowed to 2.3% y/y in August, from a revised 5.7% in July, while inflation edged up slightly to 3.4% in September from 3.3% in August.

Mirroring the prior month’s trend, domestically focused diversified counters led the sector’s outperformance. Growthpoint (+15.3%) led the charge as it built on post-results momentum, while Hyprop (+14.4%), Attacq (+13.2%), and Vukile (+9.1%) rebounded from the previous month’s pullback. Vukile’s rally was supported by the successful placement of c.R2.6bn. Fairvest gained +13.3% after announcing the R674m acquisition of Jozini Mall and Tugela Ferry Mall, two commuter-focused retail assets in KwaZulu-Natal, at a 10.17% yield. Its associate, Dipula (+14.2%), advanced after the market digested its R559m equity raise. SA Corporate (+10.4%) rallied after reporting the R545m disposal of Bluff Towers, with proceeds partially recycled into the R1.67bn acquisition of The Parks Lifestyle Apartments at a 9.55% yield. In contrast, offshore-focused counters, particularly UK-exposed names, lagged – with Shaftesbury Capital (-1.9%), MAS (-0.7%), and Supermarket Income REIT (+1.3%) posting muted performance.

Looking ahead, we remain constructive on the sector, supported by improving earnings growth and stronger balance sheets, paving the way for renewed acquisitive activity after years of muted deal flow. The ALPI’s 20.95% year-to-date return is ahead of expectations but understandable given the re-rating on the long end of the yield curve. Over the next 12 months, low double-digit total returns are achievable. With inflation contained and the rand stable, focus now turns to the SARB’s November MPC meeting and the Medium-Term Budget Statement (MTBPS), where a positive fiscal update could support bond prices further.

TER and Transaction Costs (Incl. VAT)
